

2019 SUSTAINABLE SUPPLY CHAIN INTERNATIONAL STUDENT COMPETITION IN SUSTAINABLE AQUACULTURE

The improvement of practical knowledge and ability in solving real problems in sustainable food production and processing is essential for students in Food-related studies to meet the current requirements of professional skills by the job market.

The ISEKI-Food Association (<u>www.iseki-food.net</u>) in collaboration with UNIBO-Alma Mater Studiorum University of Bologna, Italy (<u>www.unibo.it</u>) as part of the NextFOOD project, Educating the Next Generation of Agri-Food Professionals (<u>www.nextfood-project.eu</u>), opens the call for the **Sustainable Supply Chain International Student Competition 2019** with teams from universities worldwide that will compete in a competition based on participatory education and action-learning to find the best solutions to a specific production or process problem/challenge in sustainable food systems. This 1st cycle of the international competition will aim to answer the following question in sustainable aquaculture:

How can we define and ensure holistic and measurable quality that consumers understand?

Where *'measurable quality'* means quantitative or qualitative assessment of product or process. We welcome project proposals that address this question in any way, some examples may include feed or formulation changes; innovative production, processing or packaging; eco-preservation; innovations in distribution and logistics.

We are looking for teams of 3 to 5 Master's students + 1 faculty mentor in food study programmes anywhere in the world that will participate in an innovative, learner-centric environment based on active, action-oriented learning to develop a project including a specific objective/target, the design and development of a solution exploitable at the industry level, and with the main aim of contributing to innovation in sustainable food systems as well as quality and safety of foods.
